

How to Request your GCIC (Georgia Crime Information Center) Criminal History

You can request a copy of your GCIC criminal history from most law enforcement agencies in the state of Georgia. In order to best review your criminal history, Georgia Justice Project (GJP) recommends obtaining your Purpose Code U report. Only you or your attorney have the right to get your own Purpose Code U report. A Purpose Code U report shows arrests that have been restricted (expunged), time-expired restricted, or discharged under the First Offender Act. This is your complete Georgia criminal history record – similar to what law enforcement can see. This complete report will allow GJP's attorneys and paralegal to fully assess your criminal history. Please note that a Purpose Code U GCIC is a personal copy of your record and should not be shared with anyone.

I. Metro Atlanta

If you live in the Metro Atlanta area, you can obtain a Purpose Code U from the following locations:

If you believe you have a warrant for your arrest, please do not visit an arresting agency to obtain your GCIC. You may reach out to intake@GJP.org for further assistance in getting your record.

II. Outside Metro Atlanta

No matter where you live in Georgia, you can request a Purpose Code U report. According to GCIC Operations Bulletin 2017-03, **all** local law enforcement agencies must provide a Purpose Code U report for record review reasons. The cost is usually between \$10 and \$25.
